The Virginia Interfaith Center for Public Policy organized and hosted a "Consumer Finance Reform & Regulation" policy discussion call with Sen. Warner on Monday May 18th attended by 40+ faith leaders from across Virginia. VICPP also recruited participants to the National Faith-Based Partnerships teleconference held by Director Richard Cordray of the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau on May 21st.
