THE RULES HAVE CHANGED.

Beginning July 1, 2021, all expectant mothers in Virginia will become eligible for FAMIS Prenatal Coverage regardless of their immigration status if they meet all other eligibility criteria.

Approximately 7,000 Virginian women are currently pregnant and uninsured, and stand to benefit from the new rules.

NEW ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Are you eligible?

If you are uninsured and expecting, you may be eligible for the new FAMIS Prenatal Coverage for non-citizens if you:

Provide your estimated date of delivery and number of children you are expecting
