Not Just Tulsa. 26 Recorded Black Massacres in the U.S.

Many of these massacres included the widespread destruction of property and near complete exile of Black residents from their community. This list is not comprehensive. Several of them were initially categorized as a race riot, relying on reports that excluded eyewitness testimony of Black survivors.
