Pray. Pray for workers who struggle to earn wages that can lift them out of poverty. Give thanks for employers who share their businesses' prosperity with their workers and pray that a spirit of fairness will touch the hearts of those who can afford to pay living wages but do not.

Study. Learn more about how low wages keep families in poverty. Download the 2020 ALICE in Virginia, a Financial Hardship Study, an excellent report prepared by the United Ways of Virginia that tells the story of families that are ALICE – asset limited, income constrained, employed. Act. Support businesses in your community that pay living wages. Alexandria, Charlottesville, Harrisonburg, and Richmond have local living wage certification programs. A statewide program was launched in fall of 2021. Find the list of certified businesses at **www.livingwagevirginia.org**. You can also help grow the program and awareness of living wages by encouraging businesses to get certified. The simple and free certification process can be done online at **www.livingwagevirginia.org**. The state living wage standard is \$17.50. The local living wage standards range from \$15 to \$17.
