


Importance of Elections

What you need to know for the **2023 Election!**

EVERY Seat in Virginia's state legislature is up for election!




What does this mean?

The House of Delegates is up for a vote every two years, and the State Senate is on the ballot every four years. **The 2023 election will impact both chambers**, and will affect what policies can be passed. Individual candidates' positions are important to understand when deciding who to vote for.

This is the first state election since redistricting!

What you need to know for the 2023 Election!



What does this mean?

This is the *first state election in new districts*. Many voters will see new faces on the ballot, and long-time legislators decided to retire now rather than face a primary challenge. With the retirements and primaries, Virginia's legislature will face a *historically high turnover rate of 30%*. This means that a lot of the responsibility will be placed on you, the voters!

What you need to know for the **2023 Election!**


The state legislators pass more laws than congress!



What does this mean?

Just *this past year*, **Virginia Legislature passed over 800+ laws**, where as **Congress only passed 308 laws**. Many of these decisions made on the state level impact your daily lives. Such as laws that affect *speed limit, affordable housing, criminal justice reform, worker protections, and more.*





Virginia's new sameday registration law allows you to register and cast a provisional ballot at the same time! Vote early or on election day!

Primary Election - June 20th

Early In-Person Voting Begins - Sept 22nd

Voting Registration Deadline - October 16th

Virginia allows same-day voter registration for casting provisional ballots through election day!

General Election - November 7th


